

The **Smoke-Free Arizona Act** (the Act) prohibits smoking inside and within 20 feet of entrances, open windows, and ventilation systems of most enclosed public places and places of employment. The main purpose of the Smoke-Free Arizona Act is to protect workers, customers, and the general public from the harmful effects of secondhand smoke in most enclosed public places and places of employment.

The public is encouraged to call the Arizona Department of Health Services for more information or to report businesses that are not in compliance with the Smoke-Free Arizona Act.

*Complaints regarding violations of the Smoke-Free Arizona Act may be filed anonymously and are investigated by County health departments within **15** days after receipt of the complaint.*

Please keep in mind that Smoke-Free Arizona Program officials can only enforce the provisions defined in the Act. Smoke-Free Arizona Program officials do not enforce local ordinances or in-house smoking policies that are stricter than the Smoke-Free Arizona Act.
